## PLAYING WITH WEAPONS

## experimenting with the weapons of mass literature

 ${\it Paranmanjang}$  literally means "ups and downs" or checkered past in Hangul (Korean).

In English, it is known by Night-fishing.

Experiment with the unusual and uncommon and use the "weapons of mass literature" in patterns and structures that are uncomfortable to you to write a NARRATIVE based on two scenes from the film, *Paranmanjang*.

- 1. Watch the film Park Chan-Wook film, Paranmanjang, in its entirety.
- 2. Re-watch the first two minutes and forty-four seconds of the film and write it as a NARRATIVE (story, prose, descriptive language).
- 3. Re-watch the TIME FRAME assigned to you and write it as a NARRATIVE (story, prose, descriptive language).
- 4. Title the scene by time. Use words as opposed to numbers, for example: zero one colon zero zero minutes. A subtitle is OK.
- 5. This is an interpretation. Be creative, imaginative and "risky" with your writing, for example: if you want to dialogue and do not know how to translate, IMAGINE what the character(s) is saying based on the information in the scene.
- 6. Experiment with the following in the your NARRATIVE writing:
  - juxtaposition to establish mood atmosphere and tone
  - concise and concrete language; purposeful connotation/diction
  - metaphor and or simile
  - personification
  - two-word alliterations
  - allusions and symbols
  - fresh experimental language
  - experiment with punctuation. Rewrite sentences in a variety of ways using a variety of punctuation patterns
  - mix up sentence lengths
- 7. Based on the instructions and expectations the EVALUATION will be collaboratively constructed.
