[THE PICTURE BOOK : A]

1. Find five images that you think tell the story of Shelter. The images must be figurative (not too obvious).
2. Create a title for each image. Write each title in the form of a theme statement, for example: if the topic of the image is history, you might write, **Our history defines, as well as, haunts and imprisons us.**
3. For each image, find a quote of passage from the novel that reflects the image.
4. Write the story of the images in 5-10 short and powerful sentences.

1. Package your IMAGES, QUOTES, and STORY creatively. Refer to the “Shrinking the Classics” article for guidance.
2. Read your story to your classmates. Read with enthusiasm and expression. Be prepared to answer questions about the images and quotes.
